RAIN

Beginning with both loose "claw" hands in front of each shoulder, palms facing down, bring the hands downward with a double movement.

Hint: Raindrops falling.



WORSHIP HANDS

Arms are extended toward your sides and up, up either a little or a lot with palms up.

FORGIVE

Brush the fingertips of the bent right hand, palm facing down, with a repeated movement from the heel to the fingers of

the open left palm held up in front of the body.

Hint: Brushing aside a mistake.

We all have been there, whether rich or poor, sick or healthy, secure or on the streets. In fact, it is easier to lose our way when things are good, when we are healthy, when all the bills are easily paid. Why is that? Maybe because we are leaning on our own stake in the ground and not the stake Jesus put in the ground - the cross! Think about it. Ponder. How healthy is your soul? Does it need some attention - a little Jesus CPR? Does it need more time reading a few more scriptures in a really good book - and some pondering? 'He leadeth me beside the still waters.
